#### Pre-Run




Beneath cloudy skies hashers started to arrive for a Cathusalem and Sloppy Camel trail. As this was to be our Remembrance Day Run it was pleasing to see many of you wearing a Poppy in respect for our fallen Armed Forces Service Men and Women. Prior to the traditional Hash misinformation from the Hares we had a short service of remembrance. Cathusalem opened with the Last Post followed by Jock Twat's reading of The Ode of Remembrance (by Laurence Binyon) followed by a minute's silence and concluded with Cathusalem playing the Rouse.

This was followed by a pre-hash briefing given by Cathusalem. There were four trails in total, Short, Medium and Long Walks plus a Rambo Trail. No particular hazards, a few cows, some yappy dogs, Cathusalem style false trails (i.e. not necessarily back to the check), a couple of short muddy patches and one barbed wire fence challenge. The hares advised that they would be at the split points to help hashers chose their preferred challenge.

#### The Trail

The pack set out at 4:30 heading in an easterly direction to the road junction then turned left and after a short stretch headed of into the grasslands. The trail led through both open and tree covered areas close to the Sam Pran River and arriver at the first split having completed a limbo of the barbed wire fence. The long walk and Rambo's went right, and the short and medium walks went left. The trail continued on a gravel road and after passing the singing building (not sure what was making the noise, but it sounded like hundreds of birds) the trail went right around tomato fields. It is at this point that Little Behind and Rubber Scrubber missed the trail to the right but luckily for them they came across paper and were back on trail. This short cut enabled them to get ahead of me and Ding-a-Ling. We all then came across an On On sign on a power pole and so continued to follow paper until it led left and in the direction of home as we could see the hill, power lines and water treatment tower close to the car park. However, the trail was not that straight forward as we headed in a westerly direction skiting round field with cows. The terrain was not easy going because of recent soft ground had been rutted by many cattle feet. This would have been very heavy going if had not stopped raining over the past 48 hours or



so. Continuing to follow the fence line we reached the merge point and then continued to the split point with the Rambo and Medium trails going right and the short and long going straight on. The trail now headed out west on a gravel road and then through high grass and past a palm oil plantation before coming out on a gravel road. The trail did a one eighty here and led back on the other side of a water course back to the palm oil plantation. Hera the trail went down the side of the plantation to come out on the main gravel road heading back to the car park.
