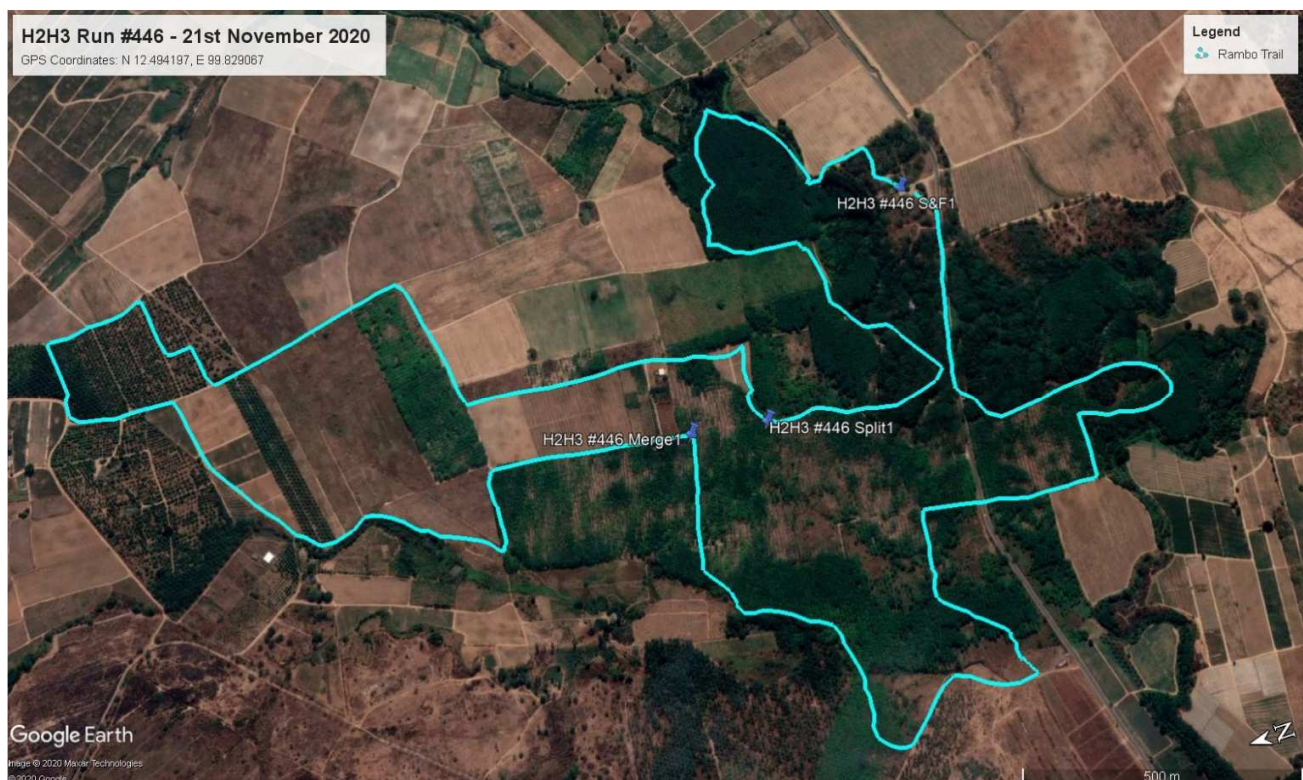

### Pre-Run

This was a return visit for the first time to a previous Mudman Run location used for Run #302 on 21<sup>st</sup> March 2015. Mudman advised the gathered Hashers, now numbering 31 that part of the trail would from the past and warned of an early water crossing and by the time we reached a second water crossing our shoes would have dried out. No other hazards to worry about such as dogs, cattle, or barbed wire fencing.

### The Trail



With the briefing over the pack set off at 4:30 following paper to the first hazard the water crossing. Wading through 6 inches of water was no problem for the hardened hashers but there were a few wimps. Little Behind managed to keep dry feet by piggybacking on Matron. Others opted to take of their shoes and paddle across in



their socks. The trail then followed along side the river and then broke left and circumnavigated a rubber plantation. On we went and came close to the main road. The trail then went right and headed north to the run/walk split. The walkers proceeding straight and the Rambo's to the right. Soon after the trail went left, and a very long straight stretch lay ahead. It may have been a bad move on my part to choose to go on this Rambo trail as now on I never saw another hash until I made it back to the start. The trail circumnavigated several plantations of either mango, banana, or rubber before reaching the merge point some 3.4 km later. On I plodded through rubber plantations coming across a two-bar log stream crossing and the on till coming across a Rubber Farmers shed. It was at this point I could not find trail and spent 15 minutes and covering 800 m looking for trail. As the light was now fading even more so under a tree canopy I resorted to modern technology and referred to my tacker on the phone and head in the direction of the most obvious track. Upon reaching the track I came across paper and continued. on trail. However, seeing the road straight ahead and more plantations to my left opted to take a more direct route back to the start. As a result, I missed the second water crossing and a big loop on the opposite side of the road.
