

Pre-Run


It was not looking good for hashing during the morning as in Hua Hin it was overcast and raining for most of the morning and early afternoon. It was still raining as I left 3 pm to pick up ice and head to the run site on Springfield Road in the Cha-Am area. It stopped raining as I was getting the ice and there was no more rain on route to the run site. I arrived at a deserted run site and with no HHH sign at the junction wondered if I had the correct location. My phone confirmed I was at the correct location and then Matron and Little Behind arrived and questioned the location although they were sure of the GPS coordinates. Shortly thereafter the Hares arrived and by now had put up the signs directing to the run site. Next was a call from Jock Twat saying he was at the specified distance from the bypass but no sign of where the hash site was. He was reassured to continue heading west to the brow of the incline where he would see an HHH sign indicating a right turn. As time went on more hashers arrived. For those of you who decided not to show because of the rain in Hua Hin area made a big mistake as it was dry at the run location and no sign of any recent rain and not likely to be in the future with light cloud cover and a little sunshine. GM Donga called the pack to order for the pre-run briefing by the hares Head Ballcock, Hong Ting Tong and Cock in a Frock who apparently was responsible for the speed bump. Usual marking with paper on the right and a few checks and false trails. No barbed wire crossings, cattle, or dogs. One split for the Rambo speed bump which was recommended by the Hares as the views across the countryside were spectacular.

The Trail

With the pack fully briefed they set off in an easterly direction. As I was on medical advice to rest a swollen left foot, Mudman was willing to carry my GPS tracker to record his trail the result of which is below and for some reason did not record the first section. However, Ding-a-Lings Strava record confirmed the start and what appeared to be The Grand Old Duke of York's march to the top of the hill and down again. Regrettably no response to a request for some written feedback on the trails. While the pack was out on trail, I together with Golden Delicious and Orange Pippin



reversed the last part of the trail including the crossing of the stream and past the water hole where locals were bathing. On the way back to the cars Onefer caught up with us and was a little worried that some would get lost towards the end due to lack of paper. Apparently, this had been a problem as an elder lady had been collecting up the paper during the week despite HBC relaying and checking the known area before the start. Onefer confirmed that in the Saturday case it was a small boy doing the collecting. As a result, some hashers ended up on the Springfield Road and headed for home. However, many did find the true trail to return home.

The walkers were out for the best part of an hour with Rambo’s coming back in one and a half hours. Apparently, the views from the hilltop were worth the climb with CiaF acting like the Duke of York at the hilltop. Although it looks like it was one trail up and down in fact, there were two separate trails although not that far apart. The hounds had worked up a thirst which was appropriately quenched. As darkness drew in GM Donga called the pack to order for the awards.
